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Enrollment Highlights

Fact Book, 2017

Enrollment

- The total Fall 2017 enrollment was 10,663, representing an increase of 184 students (2%) from Fall 2016. The full-time equivalent (FTE) for Fall 2017 increased 2% to 10,112 during the same period.
- The total Fall 2017 undergraduate enrollment was 9,898, representing an increase of 151 students (2%) from Fall 2016.
- Undergraduate degree and non-degree seeking students comprised 93% of the total Fall 2017 enrollment with graduate degree and non-degree-seeking students accounting for 7% of the student population. Graduate degree-seeking students have increased 34% since Fall 2013.
- Since 2004, the number of students attending May, Summer I, and Summer II semesters has grown from 3,347 to 5,234 (56%). In the same period, the number of credit hours taken increased from 13,216 to 21,332 (61%).

Demographics

- Female students made up 54% of the total undergraduate enrollment and 71% of the total graduate enrollment in Fall 2017.
- In Fall 2017, 91% of all undergraduate students were enrolled full-time.
- Fifty-one percent (51%) of all students enrolled are from the state of South Carolina. In Fall 2017, the largest percentage of out-of-state students came from New Jersey (6%), Maryland (6%), and Pennsylvania (5%). International student enrollment for Fall 2017 was 237 students, two percent (2%) of the overall student population.
- In Fall 2017, all South Carolina counties were represented in the total student enrollment with Horry County representing the largest number of students at 2,250 (41%) followed by Richland at 418 (8%), Georgetown at 312 (6%), and Florence at 215 (4%) counties.
- The most prominent ethnic groups represented in Fall 2017 were White/non-Hispanic (68%) and Black/African American (19%).

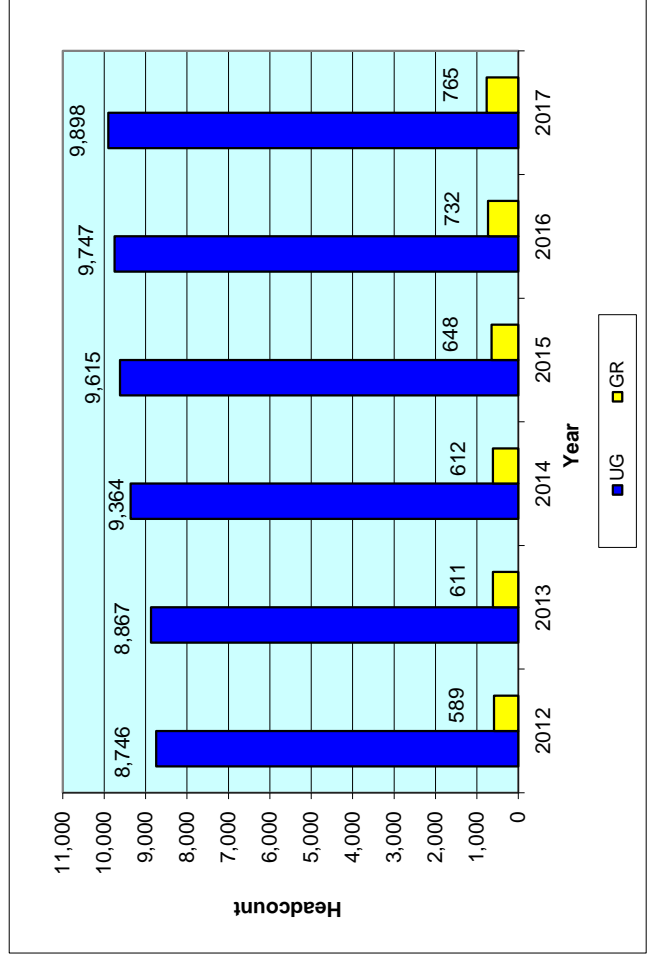

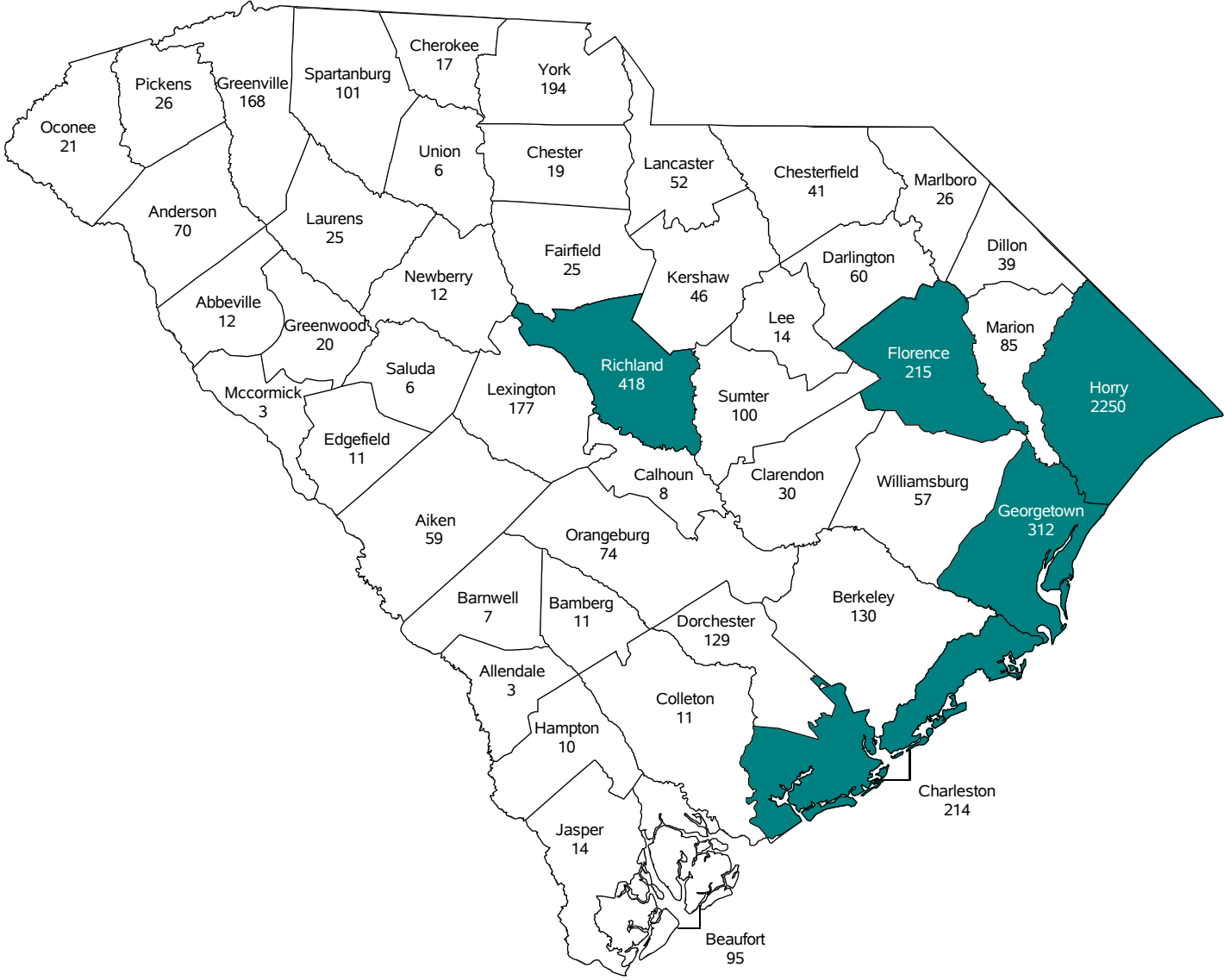

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First-time Students Highlights

Fact Book, 2017

Enrollment and academic trends for first-time students show the following:

- Applications from new undergraduate students increased 26% between Fall 2013 and Fall 2017. New student acceptances increased by 23%, and new student enrollment increased 10% during this period. In Fall 2017, 24% of all accepted applicants enrolled.
- The average SAT score for Fall 2017 freshmen was 1,098, exceeding the national average (1,060) and the South Carolina statewide average (1,064). The average ACT composite score of 22 for freshmen was greater than the national average (21) and the South Carolina statewide average (19).
- The Fall 2017 freshman cohort average high school GPA of 3.58 increased from the Fall 2016 cohort average high school GPA of 3.48. Since 2013, the freshman cohort average high school GPA has increased from 3.40 to 3.58. Eighty-five percent (85%) of Fall 2017 first-time full-time freshmen reported high school GPAs equal to or exceeding 3.00. Twenty-eight percent (28%) indicated a high school GPA between 3.00 and 3.49; 57% reported a GPA of 3.50 or higher.
- Of the 2,246 Fall 2016 first-time full-time freshman cohort, 1,508 students (67%) chose to continue their studies at the University for Fall 2017. The one-year retention for the 2016 cohort is 67%, lower than the one-year retention for the Fall 2015 cohort (69%).
- In geographic origin, 642 (43%) continuing students were native to South Carolina and 866 (57%) students were from other U.S. states and international origins.
- Among the academic colleges, the continuation of first-time full-time freshmen for Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 is as follows: Wall College of Business Administration (67%), Spadoni College of Education (77%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (73%), College of Science (66%), and University College (59%).

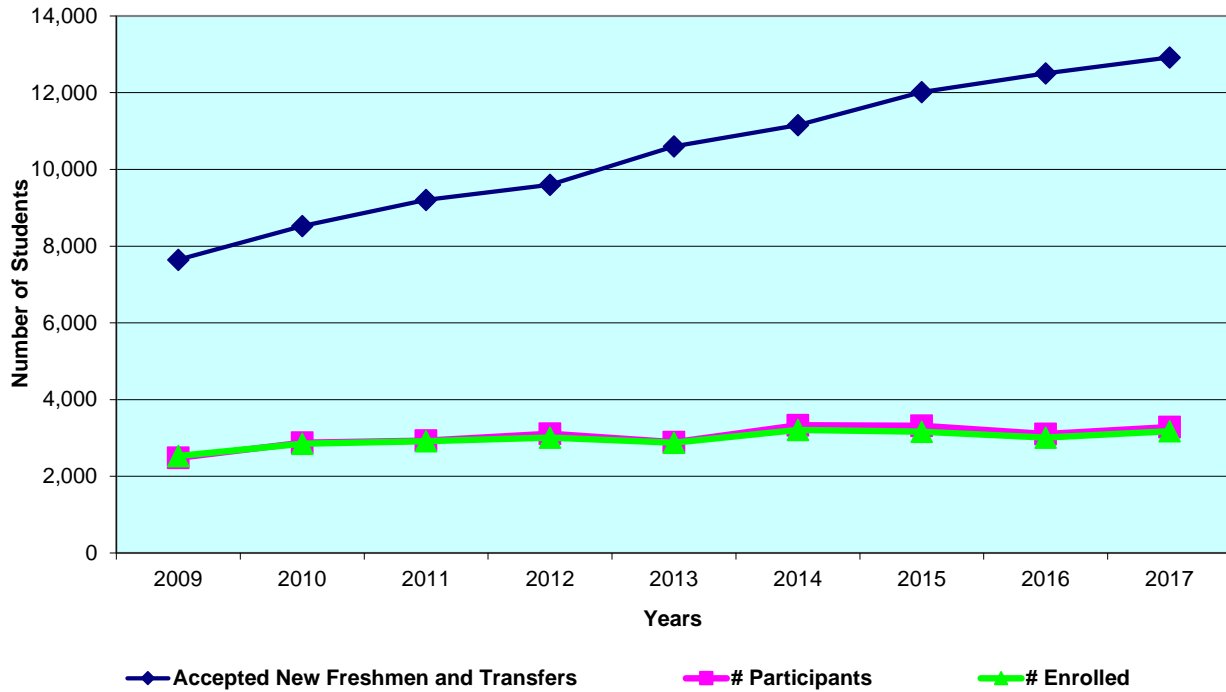
Demographics - First-time Full-time Freshmen - Fall 2017

- The most prominent ethnic groups among the Fall 2017 first-time full-time freshmen were White (68%), Black/African American (18%), and Two or More Races (6%).

- Female students outnumbered male students in the Fall 2017 full-time first-time freshman cohort with 56% of the total.
- Ninety-nine percent of Fall 2017 first-time full-time freshmen were under 20 years of age.
- Seventeen percent (17%) of first-time full-time freshmen originated from the immediate five-county service area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately 28% originated from other South Carolina counties.
- In Fall 2017, 10% of first-time full-time freshmen had not declared a major. The four most popular undergraduate majors at Coastal Carolina University among first-time freshmen were: Marine Science (13%), Exercise and Sport Science (9%), Management (8%), and Biology (7%).

First-time Full-time Transfers - Fall 2017

- In Fall 2017, there were 737 newly enrolled first-time full-time transfer students, representing an increase of 7% from Fall 2016 (688).
- The most prominent ethnic groups among the Fall 2017 first-time full-time transfer students were White (64%), Black/African American (20%), and Two or More Races (5%).
- Female students comprised 49% of first-time full-time transfer students.
- First-time full-time transfer students consisted mostly of students between the ages of 20 and 22 (60%) and less than 20 years of age (22%).
- In Fall 2017, more in-state transfer students enrolled (53%) than out-of-state students (43%). International students comprised 4% of the non-in-state transfer students.
- In Fall 2017, 28% of first-time full-time transfer students originated from the immediate five-county service area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately 25% originated from other South Carolina counties.
- Of the 737 first-time full-time transfer students in Fall 2017, 74% transferred 30 credit hours or more.
- Approximately 1% of first-time full-time transfer students had not declared a major in Fall 2017. The five most popular majors for transfer students were: Exercise and Sport Science (9%), Management (9%), Marine Science (7%), Marketing (6%), and Biology (5%).

Migration and retention trends of 2016 first-time transfer students

- The number of students (761) who transferred to the University in 2016 decreased by 4% from 2015. Transfer students who came from other South Carolina higher education institutions comprised approximately 48% of the total transfer student population in 2016. The majority of in-state transfer students (50%) were previously enrolled at Horry Georgetown Technical College.

- The first-year student retention rate for 2016 transfer students was 73%, representing a decrease of 1% from 2015.
- There were a total of 688 first-time full-time transfer students enrolled at the University in Fall 2016. Of the 2016 transfer student cohort, 502 students chose to continue their studies at the University the following year. The one-year retention rate for the Fall 2016 cohort is 73% which is higher than the one-year retention for the Fall 2015 cohort (74%).
- In geographic origin, 269 (54%) continuing students were native to South Carolina and 233 (46%) students were from other U.S. states or international origins.
- Among the academic colleges, the continuation of first-time full-time transfer students from Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 was: Wall College of Business Administration (77%), Spadoni College of Education (71%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (74%), College of Science (71%), and University College (77%).

Undergraduate Major by Class

In Fall 2017, there were 9,898 undergraduate students: 30% were freshmen, 22% sophomores, 22% juniors, 22% seniors, and 4% non-degree seeking students.

Enrollment by Major

Undergraduate: There was a 13% increase in undergraduate student enrollment between Fall 2012 and Fall 2017.

- Wall College of Business Administration: 19% increase between Fall 2012 and Fall 2017.
- Spadoni College of Education: 7% decrease between Fall 2012 and Fall 2017.
- Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts: 30% increase between Fall 2012 and Fall 2017. The Intelligence and National Security Studies major grew 920% in enrollment.
- College of Science: 12% increase between Fall 2012 and Fall 2017. The Health Administration and Biochemistry majors continued to grow with increases in enrollment during the five year period at 1,467% and 58%, respectively.

Graduate: There was a 61% increase in the number of degree-seeking graduate students between Fall 2012 and Fall 2017.

Average Size of Lecture Classes

In Fall 2017, the average size of lower- and upper-division lecture classes for the University was 25.4 and 21.2, respectively.

Total Degrees Awarded

In 2016-2017, 2,095 degrees were awarded. Since 1974, the University has awarded 32,108 degrees ranging from the associate to master levels. The Wall College of Business Administration awarded the highest number of degrees (8,555) between 1974 and 2017.

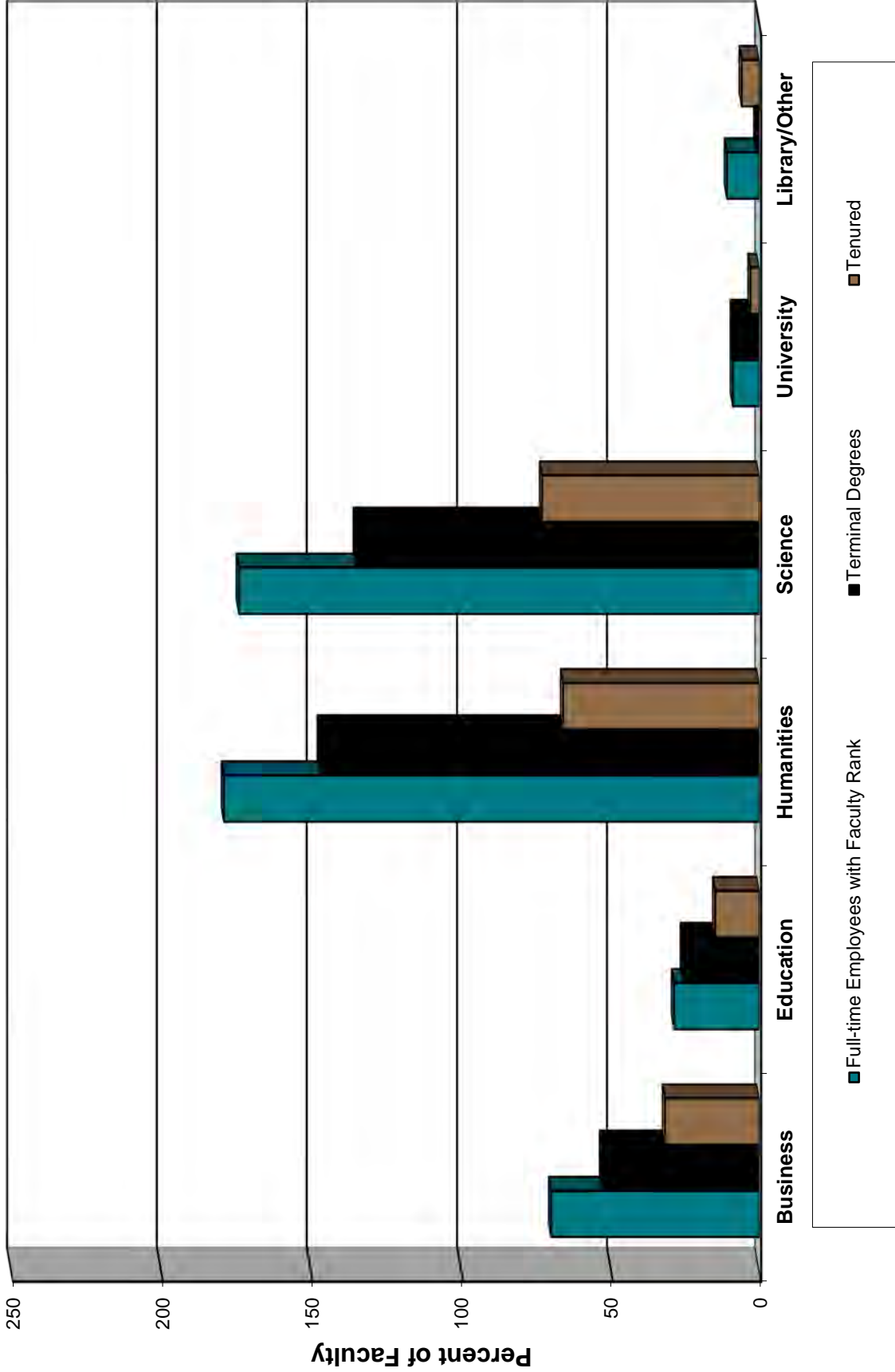

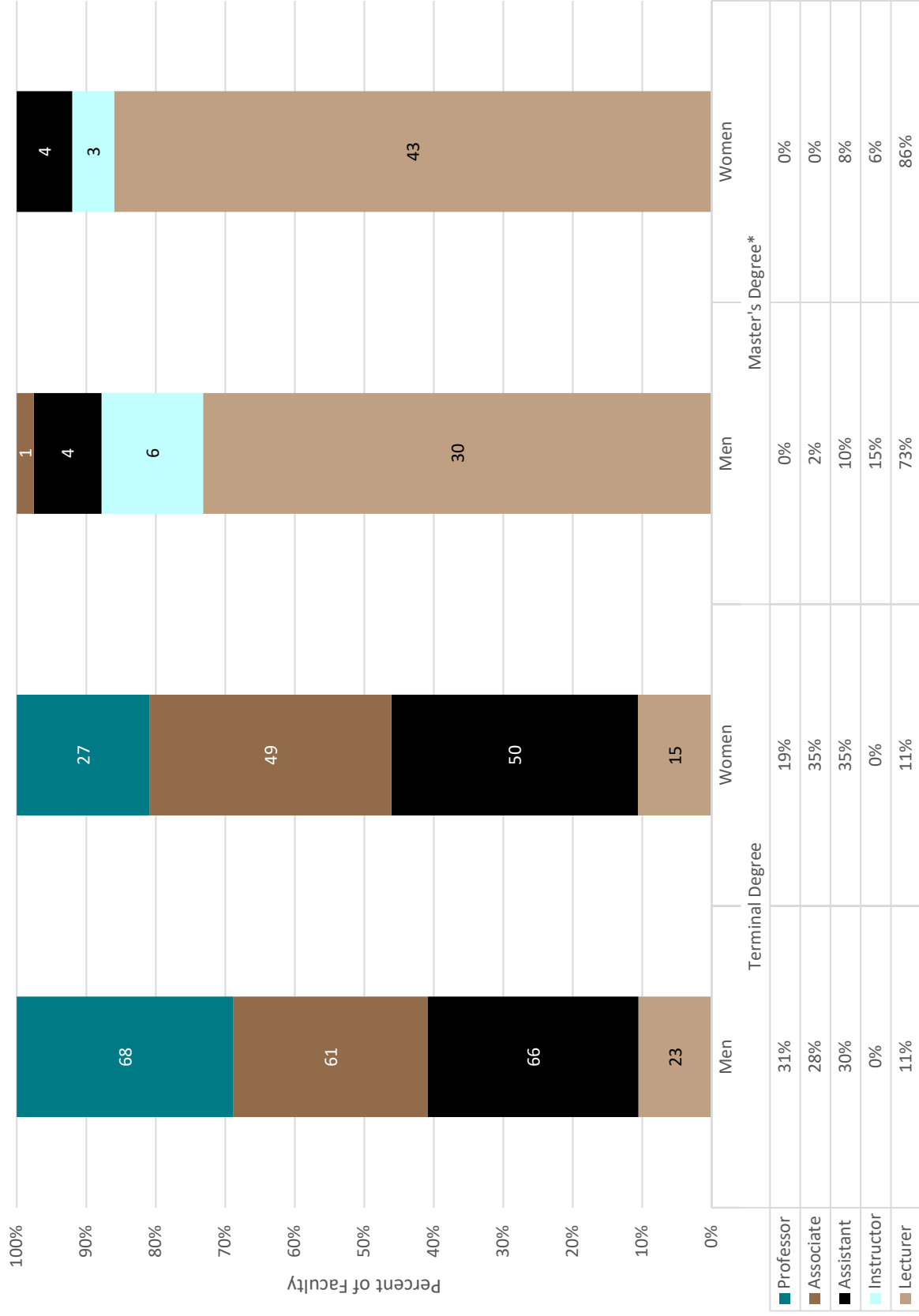

The Resources section includes Coastal Carolina University's annual tuition and residence hall fees, a comparison of in-state and out-of-state costs for South Carolina senior public institutions, total financial aid disbursements to Coastal Carolina University students by source, and the University's building inventory.

- For Fall 2017, Coastal Carolina University had a 3% increase in in-state tuition.
- Coastal Carolina University students experienced a 35% increase in total financial aid received over the five-year period from 2011-2012 to 2016-2017.
- For Fall 2017, Coastal Carolina University operated/managed 131 facilities with 205 classrooms and laboratories and 853,748 net square feet for educational and general (E&G) usage.

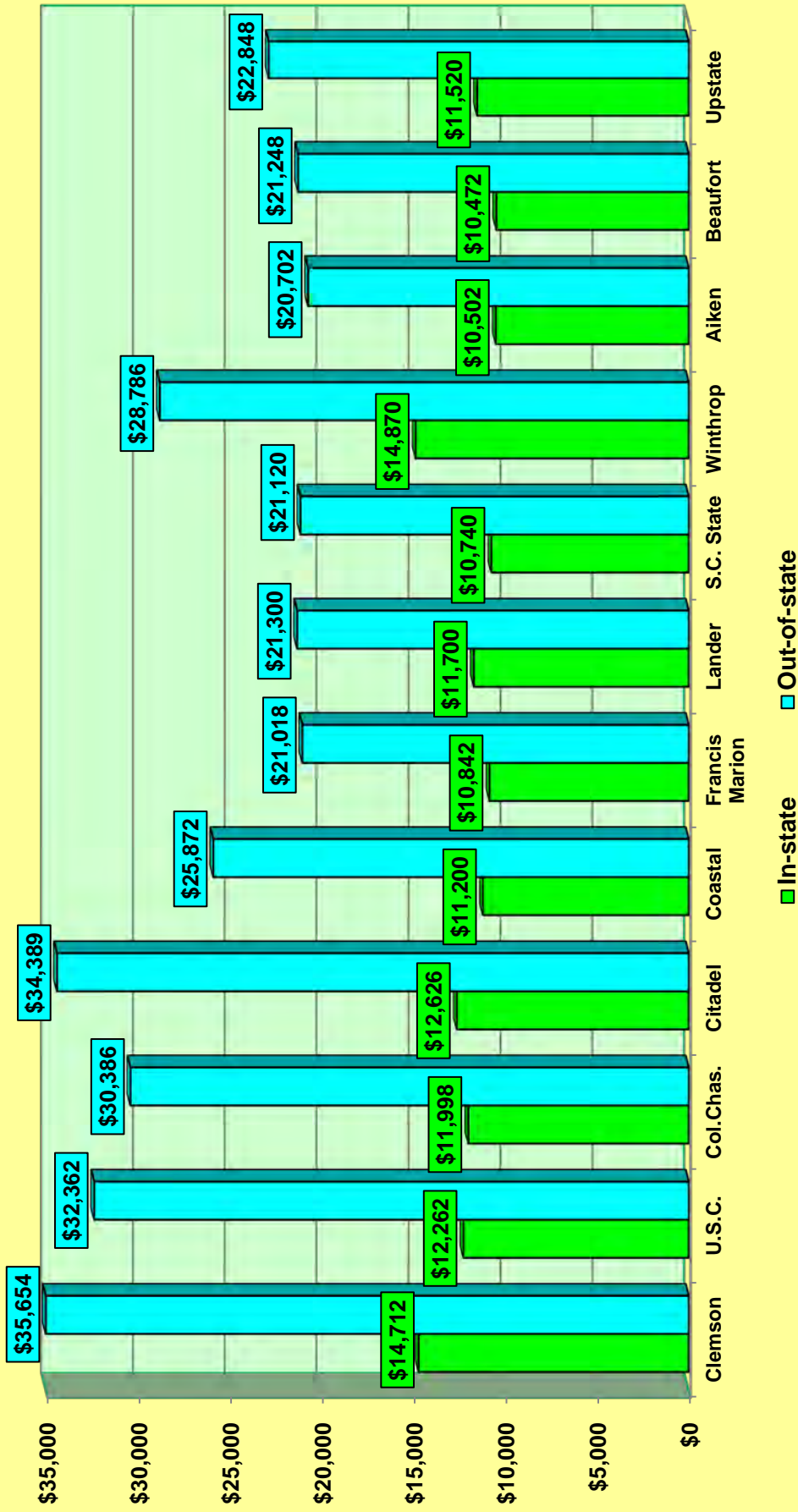

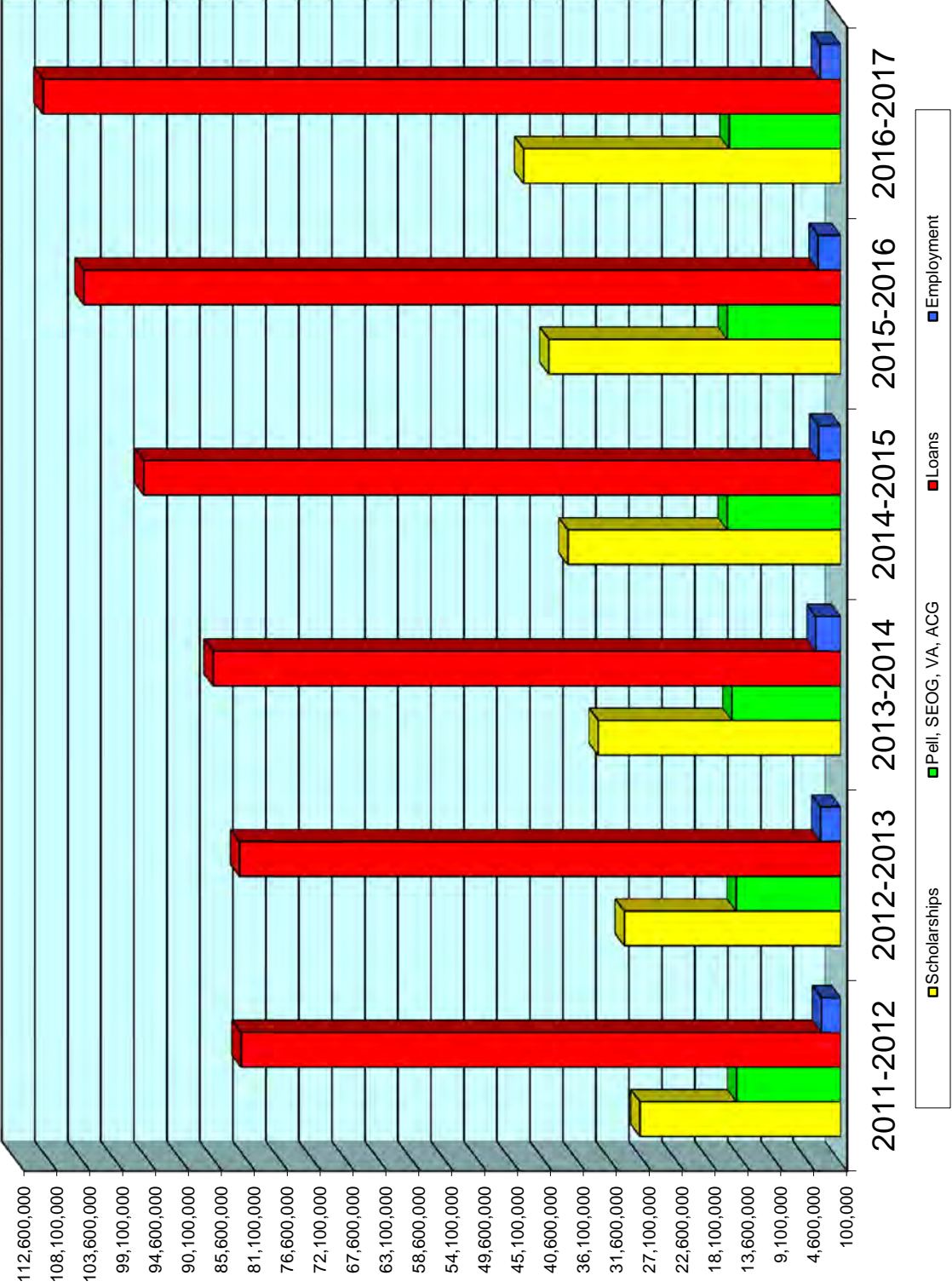
