

ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book. 2015

Enrollment

- The total Fall 2015 enrollment was 10,263, representing an increase of 287 students (3%) from Fall 2014. The full-time equivalent (FTE) for Fall 2015 increased 4% to 9,804 during the same period.
- The total Fall 2015 undergraduate enrollment was 9,615, representing an increase of 251 students (3%) from Fall 2014.
- Undergraduate degree and non-degree-seeking students comprised 94% of the total Fall 2015 enrollment with graduate degree and non-degree-seeking students accounting for 6% of the student population. Graduate degree-seeking students have increased 41% since Fall 2011.
- Since 2002, the number of students attending May, Summer I, and Summer II semesters has grown from 3,879 to 4,325 (11%). In the same period, the number of credit hours taken increased from 13,904 to 17,631 (27%).

Demographics

- Female students made up 53% of the total undergraduate enrollment and 68% of the total graduate enrollment in Fall 2015.
- In Fall 2015, 91% of all undergraduate students were enrolled full-time.
- Fifty-one percent (51%) of all students enrolled are from the state of South Carolina. In Fall 2015, the largest percentage of out-of-state students came from New Jersey (7%), Maryland (6%), and New York (6%). International student enrollment for Fall 2015 was 178 students, two percent (2%) of the overall student population.
- In Fall 2015, all South Carolina counties were represented in the total student enrollment with Horry County representing the largest number of students at 2,280 (44%) followed by Richland at 338 (7%), Georgetown at 327 (6%), and Charleston at 224 (4%) counties.
- The most prominent ethnic groups represented in Fall 2015 were White/non-Hispanic (69%) and Black/African American (19%).





FIRST-TIME STUDENTS HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book. 2015

Enrollment and academic trends for first-time students show the following:

- Applications from new undergraduate students increased 66% between Fall 2011 and Fall 2015. New student acceptances increased by 34%, and new student enrollment increased 9% during this period. In Fall 2015, 26% of all accepted applicants enrolled.
- The average SAT score for Fall 2015 freshmen was 1,005, exceeding the average South Carolina high school score of 975. The average ACT composite score of 22 for freshmen was greater than the national average (21) and the South Carolina statewide average (20).
- The Fall 2015 freshman cohort average high school GPA of 3.42 increased from the Fall 2014 cohort average high school GPA of 3.37. Since 2011, the freshman cohort average high school GPA has increased from 3.34 to 3.42. Seventy-seven percent (77%) of Fall 2015 first-time full-time freshmen reported high school GPAs equal to or exceeding 3.00. Thirty-one percent (31%) indicated a high school GPA between 3.00 and 3.49; 46% reported a GPA of 3.50 or higher.
- Of the 2,374 Fall 2014 first-time full-time freshman cohort, 1,536 students (65%) chose to continue their studies at the University for Fall 2015. The one-year retention for the 2014 cohort is 65%, lower than the one-year retention for the Fall 2013 cohort (67%).
- In geographic origin, 637 (41%) continuing students were native to South Carolina and 899 (59%) students were from other U.S. states and international origins.
- Among the academic colleges, the continuation of first-time full-time freshmen for Fall 2014 to Fall 2015 is as follows: Wall College of Business Administration (65%), Spadoni College of Education (69%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (66%), College of Science (66%), and University College (55%).

<u>Demographics - First-Time Full-Time Freshmen - Fall 2015</u>

 The most prominent ethnic groups among the Fall 2015 first-time full-time freshmen were White (70%), Black/African American (18%), and Two or More Races (5%).



- Female students outnumbered male students in the Fall 2015 full-time first-time freshman cohort with 53% of the total.
- Ninety-eight percent of Fall 2015 first-time full-time freshmen were under 20 years of age.
- Seventeen percent (17%) of first-time full-time freshmen originated from the immediate five-county service area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately 23% originated from other South Carolina counties.
- In Fall 2015, 12% of first-time full-time freshmen had not declared a major. The four most popular undergraduate majors at Coastal Carolina University among first-time freshmen were: Marine Science (13%), Management (9%), Exercise and Sport Science (8%), and Biology (8%).





FIRST-TIME TRANSFER STUDENTS HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book. 2015

First-Time Full-Time Transfers - Fall 2015

- In Fall 2015, there were 734 newly enrolled first-time full-time transfer students, representing an decrease of 4% from Fall 2014 (764).
- The most prominent ethnic groups among the Fall 2015 first-time full-time transfer students were White (69%), Black/African American (17%), and Hispanic (5%).
- Female students comprised 49% of first-time full-time transfer students.
- First-time full-time transfer students consisted mostly of students between the ages of 20 and 22 (60%) and less than 20 years of age (19%).
- In Fall 2015, more in-state transfer students enrolled (51%) than out-of-state students (45%). International students comprised 3% of the non-in-state transfer students.
- In Fall 2015, 29% of first-time full-time transfer students originated from the immediate five-county service area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately 22% originated from other South Carolina counties.
- Of the 734 first-time full-time transfer students in Fall 2015, 72% transferred 30 credit hours or more.
- Approximately 1% of first-time full-time transfer students had not declared a major in Fall 2015. The five most popular majors for transfer students were: Management (11%), Exercise and Sport Science (9%), Biology (6%), Marketing (6%), and Marine Science (6%).

Migration and retention trends of 2014 first-time transfer students

• The number of students (834) who transferred to the University in 2014 increased by 7% from 2013. Transfer students who came from other South Carolina higher education institutions comprised approximately 44% of the total transfer student population in 2014. The majority of in-state transfer students (47%) were previously enrolled at Horry Georgetown Technical College.



- The first-year student retention rate for 2014 transfer students was 70%, representing a decrease of 3% from 2013.
- There were a total of 764 first-time full-time transfer students enrolled at the University in Fall 2014. Of the 2014 transfer student cohort, 534 students chose to continue their studies at the University the following year. The one-year retention rate for the Fall 2014 cohort is 70% which is lower than the one-year retention for the Fall 2013 cohort (73%).
- In geographic origin, 274 (51%) continuing students were native to South Carolina and 260 (49%) students were from other U.S. states or international origins.
- Among the academic colleges, the continuation of first-time full-time transfer students from Fall 2014 to Fall 2015 was: Wall College of Business Administration (69%), Spadoni College of Education (69%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (72%), College of Science (71%), and University College (52%).

The First-Time Transfer Students section is in alignment with the following supporting key strategies and goals from the Coastal Carolina University Strategic Plan:

Strategy 1: Meeting the Educational Needs of Students and Community

Expand degree and non-degree program offerings and formats while maintaining quality in all programs.

Increase retention and graduation rates by supporting programs and services that enrich the student learning and living environment and broaden the diversity of students seeking Coastal Carolina University as their choice for educational advancement.



ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

Undergraduate Major by Class

In Fall 2015, there were 9,615 undergraduate students: 31% were freshmen, 23% sophomores, 21% juniors, 22% seniors, and 3% non-degree seeking students.

Enrollment By Major

Undergraduate: There was a 17% increase in undergraduate student enrollment between Fall 2010 and Fall 2015.

- Wall College of Business Administration: 8% increase between Fall 2010 and Fall 2015.
- Spadoni College of Education: 17% decrease between Fall 2010 and Fall 2015. The enrollment in Middle Level Education increased 33%.
- Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts: 17% increase between Fall 2010 and Fall 2015. The Graphic Design major grew 93% in enrollment.
- College of Science: 32% increase between Fall 2010 and Fall 2015. The Information Systems, Biochemistry and Physics majors continued to grow with increases in enrollment during the five year period at 870%, 773%, and 161%, respectively.

Graduate: There was a 63% increase in the number of degree-seeking graduate students between Fall 2010 and Fall 2015.

Average Size of Lecture Classes

In Fall 2015, the average size of lower- and upper-division lecture classes for the University was 26.2 and 21.3, respectfully. During the last three years, the average size of lower-division lecture classes has decreased and there has been no change in the average size of upper-division lecture classes.



Total Degrees Awarded

In 2014-2015, 1,902 degrees were awarded. Since 1974, the University has awarded 28,160 degrees ranging from the associate to master levels. The Wall College of Business Administration awarded the highest number of degrees (7,358) between 1974 and 2015.

Expand degree and non-degree program offerings and formats while maintaining quality in all programs.





Faculty Profile

In Fall 2015, there were 455 full-time employees with faculty rank. Of the full-time faculty, 42% were female and 58% male.

Of full-time employees with faculty rank, 77% held terminal degrees and 61% were tenured. Of this same group, 22% were professors, 25% were associate professors, 28% were assistant professors, and 25% were instructors/other. Over 67% of FTE students were taught by full-time faculty.

Full-Time Faculty by College and Rank

In Fall 2015, each college had at least 73% of its full-time teaching staff holding the rank of Assistant Professor or higher. The breakdown for each college is as follows: Wall College of Business Administration (73%), Spadoni College of Education (88%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (74%), and College of Science (74%).

The Faculty section is in alignment with the following supporting key strategy and goals from the Coastal Carolina University Strategic Plan:

Strategy 2: Ensuring Student Success

Increase retention and graduation rates by supporting programs and services that enrich the student learning and living environment and broaden the diversity of students seeking Coastal Carolina University as their choice for educational advancement.

Goal 2.3. Supportive Learning and Living Facilities: Provide facilities and services that support a rich academic, residential, athletic, co-curricular, and sustainable environment in which students, faculty, and staff effectively interact.

Goal 3.1. Highly Qualified Faculty and Staff: Recruit and retain highly qualified and diverse faculty and staff.







The Resources section includes Coastal Carolina University's annual tuition and residence hall fees, a comparison of in-state and out-of-state costs for South Carolina senior public institutions, total financial aid disbursements to Coastal Carolina University students by source, and the University's building inventory.

- For Fall 2015, Coastal Carolina University had a 4% increase in in-state tuition.
- Coastal Carolina University students experienced a 51% increase in total financial aid received over the five-year period from 2009-2010 to 2014-2015.
- For Fall 2015, Coastal Carolina University operated/managed 127 facilities with 164 classrooms and laboratories and 744,484 net square feet for educational and general (E&G) usage.




