ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book. 2016

Enrollment

- The total Fall 2016 enrollment was 10,479, representing an increase of 216 students (2%) from Fall 2015. The full-time equivalent (FTE) for Fall 2016 increased 2% to 9,934 during the same period.
- The total Fall 2016 undergraduate enrollment was 9,747, representing an increase of 132 students (1%) from Fall 2015.
- Undergraduate degree and non-degree-seeking students comprised 93% of the total Fall 2016 enrollment with graduate degree and non-degree-seeking students accounting for 7% of the student population. Graduate degree-seeking students have increased 55% since Fall 2012.
- Since 2003, the number of students attending May, Summer I, and Summer II semesters has grown from 3,312 to 5,101 (54%). In the same period, the number of credit hours taken increased from 13,036 to 20,674 (59%).

Demographics

- Female students made up 53% of the total undergraduate enrollment and 70% of the total graduate enrollment in Fall 2016.
- In Fall 2015, 91% of all undergraduate students were enrolled full-time.
- Fifty-one percent (51%) of all students enrolled are from the state of South Carolina. In Fall 2016, the largest percentage of out-of-state students came from New Jersey (6%), Maryland (6%), and New York (6%). International student enrollment for Fall 2016 was 202 students, two percent (2%) of the overall student population.
- In Fall 2016, all South Carolina counties were represented in the total student enrollment with Horry County representing the largest number of students at 2,348 (44%) followed by Richland at 345 (6%), Georgetown at 308 (6%), and Charleston at 213 (4%) counties.
- The most prominent ethnic groups represented in Fall 2016 were White/non-Hispanic (68%) and Black/African American (19%).





FIRST-TIME STUDENTS HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book. 2016

Enrollment and academic trends for first-time students show the following:

- Applications from new undergraduate students increased 59% between Fall 2012 and Fall 2016. New student acceptances increased by 33%, and new student enrollment decreased 0.1% during this period. In Fall 2016, 24% of all accepted applicants enrolled.
- The average SAT score for Fall 2016 freshmen was 1,018, exceeding the national average (1,002) and the South Carolina statewide average (987). The average ACT composite score of 22 for freshmen was greater than the national average (21) and the South Carolina statewide average (19).
- The Fall 2016 freshman cohort average high school GPA of 3.48 increased from the Fall 2015 cohort average high school GPA of 3.42. Since 2012, the freshman cohort average high school GPA has increased from 3.32 to 3.48. Eighty-one percent (81%) of Fall 2016 first-time full-time freshmen reported high school GPAs equal to or exceeding 3.00. Thirty percent (30%) indicated a high school GPA between 3.00 and 3.49; 51% reported a GPA of 3.50 or higher.
- Of the 2,359 Fall 2015 first-time full-time freshman cohort, 1,616 students (69%) chose to continue their studies at the University for Fall 2016. The one-year retention for the 2015 cohort is 69%, higher than the one-year retention for the Fall 2014 cohort (65%).
- In geographic origin, 683 (42%) continuing students were native to South Carolina and 933 (58%) students were from other U.S. states and international origins.
- Among the academic colleges, the continuation of first-time full-time freshmen for Fall 2015 to Fall 2016 is as follows: Wall College of Business Administration (67%), Spadoni College of Education (77%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (78%), College of Science (67%), and University College (59%).

• The most prominent ethnic groups among the Fall 2016 first-time full-time freshmen were White (67%), Black/African American (19%), and Two or More Races (6%).




- Female students outnumbered male students in the Fall 2016 full-time first-time freshman cohort with 53% of the total.
- Ninety-eight percent of Fall 2016 first-time full-time freshmen were under 20 years of age.
- Eighteen percent (18%) of first-time full-time freshmen originated from the immediate five-county service area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately 26% originated from other South Carolina counties.
- In Fall 2016, 10% of first-time full-time freshmen had not declared a major. The four most popular undergraduate majors at Coastal Carolina University among first-time freshmen were: Marine Science (14%), Management (8%), Exercise and Sport Science (7%), and Biology (7%).

FIRST-TIME TRANSFER STUDENTS HIGHLIGHTS

Fact Book. 2016

First-Time Full-Time Transfers - Fall 2016

- In Fall 2016, there were 688 newly enrolled first-time full-time transfer students, representing an decrease of 6% from Fall 2015 (734).
- The most prominent ethnic groups among the Fall 2016 first-time full-time transfer students were White (67%), Black/African American (18%), and Hispanic (4%).
- Female students comprised 48% of first-time full-time transfer students.
- First-time full-time transfer students consisted mostly of students between the ages of 20 and 22 (60%) and less than 20 years of age (18%).
- In Fall 2016, more in-state transfer students enrolled (53%) than out-of-state students (43%). International students comprised 4% of the non-in-state transfer students.
- In Fall 2016, 32% of first-time full-time transfer students originated from the immediate five-county service area of Dillon, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, and Williamsburg counties. Approximately 22% originated from other South Carolina counties.
- Of the 688 first-time full-time transfer students in Fall 2016, 75% transferred 30 credit hours or more.
- Approximately 1% of first-time full-time transfer students had not declared a major in Fall 2016. The five most popular majors for transfer students were: Management (9%), Exercise and Sport Science (7%), Biology (6%), Marketing (6%), and Marine Science (6%).

Migration and retention trends of 2015 first-time transfer students

• The number of students (791) who transferred to the University in 2015 decreased by 5% from 2014. Transfer students who came from other South Carolina higher education institutions comprised approximately 46% of the total transfer student population in 2015. The majority of in-state transfer students (44%) were previously enrolled at Horry Georgetown Technical College.



- The first-year student retention rate for 2015 transfer students was 74%, representing a increase of 4% from 2014.
- There were a total of 734 first-time full-time transfer students enrolled at the University in Fall 2015. Of the 2015 transfer student cohort, 545 students chose to continue their studies at the University the following year. The one-year retention rate for the Fall 2015 cohort is 74% which is higher than the one-year retention for the Fall 2014 cohort (70%).
- In geographic origin, 287 (53%) continuing students were native to South Carolina and 258 (47%) students were from other U.S. states or international origins.
- Among the academic colleges, the continuation of first-time full-time transfer students from Fall 2015 to Fall 2016 was: Wall College of Business Administration (79%), Spadoni College of Education (69%), Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts (75%), College of Science (72%), and University College (81%).

Undergraduate Major by Class

In Fall 2016, there were 9,747 undergraduate students: 29% were freshmen, 23% sophomores, 22% juniors, 23% seniors, and 3% non-degree seeking students.

Enrollment By Major

Undergraduate: There was a 14% increase in undergraduate student enrollment between Fall 2011 and Fall 2016.

- Wall College of Business Administration: 14% increase between Fall 2011 and Fall 2016.
- Spadoni College of Education: 17% decrease between Fall 2011 and Fall 2016.
- Edwards College of Humanities and Fine Arts: 23% increase between Fall 2011 and Fall 2016. The Theatre Arts major grew 87% in enrollment.
- College of Science: 21% increase between Fall 2011 and Fall 2016. The Physics, Information Systems and Biochemistry majors continued to grow with increases in enrollment during the five year period at 100%, 93%, and 58%, respectively.

Graduate: There was a 61% increase in the number of degree-seeking graduate students between Fall 2011 and Fall 2016.

Average Size of Lecture Classes

In Fall 2016, the average size of lower- and upper-division lecture classes for the University was 25.6 and 21.2, respectfully.

Total Degrees Awarded

In 2015-2016, 1,853 degrees were awarded. Since 1974, the University has awarded 30,013 degrees ranging from the associate to master levels. The Wall College of Business Administration awarded the highest number of degrees (7,684) between 1974 and 2016.


