This letter serves as a notification that Coastal Carolina University received approval from the South Carolina Commission on Higher Education (SCCHE) on December 13, 2022, to add a distance education method of delivery for the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Special Education: Multi-categorical degree program effective Fall 2023.

The addition of this method of delivery will allow Coastal Carolina University to offer the B.A. in Special Education: Multi-categorical degree program to students working full-time in school districts as instructional aides and paraprofessionals. This change will support a "grow your own" initiative to collaborate with local school districts. Initiatives such as these are successful in recruiting and retaining educators.

Coastal Carolina University currently offers a master of education in special education as distance education program, among other programs. Therefore, the University does not have any concerns with resources to support the technology needed for a distance education program.

There are no changes to the degree requirements and no new content for the program. Student will be able to earn all credits for degree completion in the distance education method of delivery.
